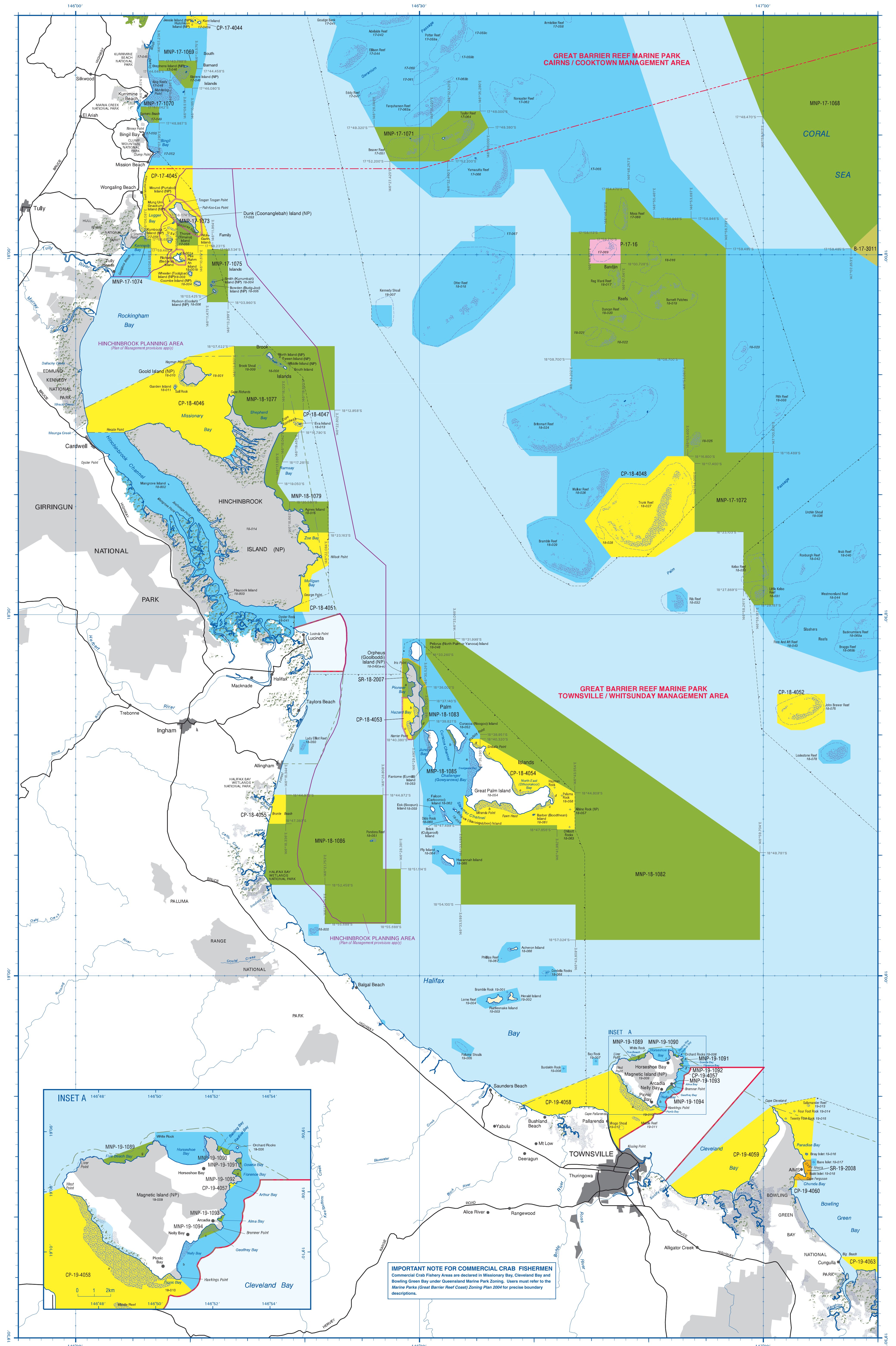

PLEASE NOTE: This guide provides an indicative overview of the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Zoning Plan 2003. It is not intended for navigational purposes. For more information on the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Zoning Plan 2003, please refer to the relevant Queensland Marine Park Zoning Plan or the Queensland Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) website.

1. Activities apply to individuals, organisations and harvest fishing for aquaculture fish, seaweeds and coral in the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park.

2. Except for One Island Reef (SR-2010) and Australian Institute of Marine Science (SR-19-008) which are managed by the Australian Institute of Marine Science, all other Marine Parks are managed by the Queensland Government.

3. Limited access (diving only, with 200m depth and limited depth per person).

4. By land or boat (not by motor) and generally no more than 200m from shore.

5. Maximum of 2 boats per person with a maximum of 10 boats per person.

6. Limited to 100m per person and 100m per line. Only 1 day (excluding a commercial fishing vessel).

7. Apart from traditional use of marine resources as described in section 1.1 of the Marine Parks Act 1997, no other traditional use of marine resources is permitted.

8. Marine species only. Seasonal closure apply to some Marine Parks.

Detailed information is contained in the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Zoning Plan and Regulations.

• Permits are required for most other activities not listed above.

• Commonwealth owned areas in the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park are zoned 'Commonwealth Islands'.

• 'Zone' shown as cream.

• All Commonwealth Islands may not be shown.

• Several Management Areas may provide additional restrictions at some locations.

• The Zoning Plan does not affect the operation of s.211 of the Marine Parks Act 1997.

1. The purpose of this map is to help interpret the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Zoning Plan 2003. The zone boundaries shown on this map are indicative only. While care has been taken to illustrate zone boundaries as accurately as possible, users must refer to Schedule 1 to the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Zoning Plan 2003 for precise boundary descriptions.

2. Zone identifiers indicate the zone type, latitude and number of each zoned area. Zones numbered on this map:

- 1 - Conservation Park Zone
- 2 - Buffer Zone
- 3 - Scientific Research Zone
- 4 - Marine National Park Zone

3. The Great Barrier Reef Marine Park includes the water column, the seabed beneath the seabed to a depth of 1000 metres below the seabed and the airspace to 915 metres above the surface.

4. Reefs, shoals and islands within the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park are numbered east to west within one-degree bands. They are prefixed with the latitude at the top of the band in which they lie. A cosine point is used to determine the appropriate one-degree band for features straddling parallels.

5. Islands, or parts of islands that form part of Queensland and are not owned by the Commonwealth, are not part of the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park.

6. The information displayed is held in the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Authority Geospatial Data Library. This includes data provided by Geoscience Australia National Mapping Division (including the GEOCAT product) and the Australian Hydrographic Office. Land tenure was derived from data supplied by the Queensland Department of Natural Resources, Mines and Water.

7. While every effort has been made to show all features necessary to make this map a useful general reference, map users are invited to advise the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Authority of any errors, omissions or other suggestions that would enhance this product. IMPORTANT NOTE FOR COMMERCIAL CRAB FISHERMEN

Commercial Crab Fishery Areas are declared in Missionary Bay, Cleveland Bay and Bowling Green Bay under Queensland Marine Park Zoning. Users must refer to the Marine Parks (Great Barrier Reef Coast) Zoning Plan 2004 for precise boundary descriptions.

IMPORTANT NOTES FOR MAP USERS

This map may not show all Queensland State Marine Park zoning (for example, State Marine Parks where declared between high and low water). For more information on these areas, please refer to the relevant Queensland Marine Park Zoning Plans or see Queensland Environmental Protection Agency offices. Restrictions and/or closures under Queensland legislation (eg. Fisheries Regulation 1995 (Old)) are not shown. Users should familiarise themselves with all legal requirements relevant to their particular activities before entering or using the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park.

The inshore boundary of the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park follows the coastline of Queensland at low water except to the extent such waters are within the limits of the State of Queensland within the meaning of section 14 of the Seas & Submerged Lands Act 1973, or where otherwise indicated (such as port areas). Any depiction of the inshore boundary on this map is indicative only.
